The inauguration of democracy in India was a result of a covenant: the elite, the middle class and the intelligentsia, highly accomplished and rather well off on the one side; and the ordinary people with all their problems and disabling conditions on the other hand. The two disparate worlds – modern and liberal against the unexposed and unequipped – entered into a new kind of deal. The elite made a promise about the future. Nehru's 'tryst with destiny' made on the eve of independence where he said 'now the time comes when we shall redeem our pledge' is a personification of that promise held out to the people. The elite were now in the seat of power. Till a while ago they had been one with the people in the anti colonial struggles.

Whatever the social origins of the elites – mostly well off middle classes from the upper castes (the dwija castes), with a sprinkling of the lower castes – they were all bound in a shared world with the ordinary people. This was a world born out of struggles. Outside this shared world there were two divergent voices – the Marxist left led by the Communist Party fighting for the revolution, and the Hindu rightwing which opted for the restoration of the old social order embodying the glory that was the 'Indian' past. The Communist party was at the head of a mass upsurge in the time of independence, the like of which the country never again experienced and the Hindu rightwing, as an organised force, was then a miniscule presence.

The covenant was not just an 'act of faith' as it is often made out to be. It had a history behind it inescapable for all; the elite were as much involved in it as were the masses. Two aspects of this history are worth mentioning. Of lesser salience for the argument to be presented here is the history of constitutional developments, which over a long period of time created a political establishment adept at handling modern constitutional institutions. The other is that India saw one of the longest fought freedom struggles in the world. Its limits were those imposed by the bourgeois outlook and the dominant leadership. Nevertheless, one significant feature of the national movement was the constant pressure exerted by the radical urge among the people within it. The anti-feudal struggles of the peasantry formed the most important component of the radical impulse.
