



Structure of the Eye

The eye consists of three layers: The outer layer consists of the sclera and cornea. The middle layer consists of the choroid, ciliary body and iris. The inner layer consists of the retina. Cornea is the round, transparent area that allows light to pass into the eye. Lens is the transparent structure that focuses light onto the retina. Retina is the inner membrane of the eye that receives information about light using rods and cones. The functioning of the retina is similar to the spinal cord -both act as a highway for information to travel on Pupil is the opening at the centre of the iris which controls the amount of light entering the eye. It Dilates and Constricts. Rods & Cones-rods (approximately 120 million) than cones (approx 6.4 million).Rods are the visual receptor cells that are important for night vision and peripheral vision. The rods are better for night vision because they are much more sensitive than cones. In addition, the rods are better for peripheral vision because there are many more on the periphery of the retina. The cones are mostly in and around the fovea but decrease as we go out. To see best at night, look just above or below the object. This keeps the image on the rods. Cones, the visual receptor cells are important in daylight vision and colour vision. The cones work well in daylight, but not in dim lighting. This is why it is more difficult to see colours in low light. Most cones are located in the centre of the retina called the Fovea, which is a tiny spot in the centre of the retina that contains only cones. Visual acuity is best here. We can see many colours, but there are only 3 types of cones that receive information about colour. We have cones that pick up light waves for red, green, and blue. When light falls onto an object, the light is reflected and directed to our eyes. The light travels through the pupil and passes through the lens. The lens sharpens the image of the object, inverts it and displays it on the retina. It is inverted because the rays coming through the eyes are refracted and cross each other. The retina is a very complex tissue, made up of optic nerves (photoreceptors) that are special nerves for detecting light. The optic nervesare the neurons that take the inverted image from the retina and send it to a special part of the brain. The brain interprets it and tells us what the object is and what to do. All this happens within millions of a second
