Albert Bandura's Social Development Theory

Albert Bandura Social Cognitive Theory (SCT) is used in psychology, education and communication. It holds that a portion of an individual's knowledge acquisition can be directly

related to observing others within the context of social interactions, experiences, outside media influences. In other words, the survival of humanity is dependent upon copying of the actions of others. SCT is the result of the work done by Neal E. Miller and John Dollard in 1941. They identified four key factors in learning new behavior:

- 1) Drives
- 2) Cues
- 3) Responses, and
- 4) Rewards

According to Bandura's theory of child development, children learn new behaviors from observing other people. There are five core concepts associated with the SCT framework: (1) observational learning/modeling, (2) outcome expectations, (3) self-efficacy, (4) goal setting and (5) self-regulation.

Depending on whether people are rewarded or punished for their behavior and the outcome of the behavior, that behavior may become a model. 'Self-efficacy' is believing in yourself to perform action. It is the belief in one's capabilities to organize and execute the course of action required to manage prospective situations. The best example is Ekalavya, the hunter-boy in the Mahabharata, whose observational learning and self-efficacy made him an efficient archer. Bandura, along with his students and colleagues conducted a series of studies, known as the "Bobo Doll Experiment", to find out why and when children display aggressive behaviors. These studies demonstrated the value of modelling for acquiring novel behaviors.

Researches show that in both children and adults, genetic makeup exerts a greater influence on personality traits than environmental factors.

Personality is dynamic i.e. it is constantly evolving and changing. A newborn infant lacks personality because his or her behavior keeps on changing. An infant's personality is influenced by heredity and by surrounding conditions. Personality development begins at birth and gradually unfolds until death. Some researchers have investigated to see if the happiness and outgoing nature seen in adults starts building up from the childhood stage. Findings of these researches show that high degrees of sociability and low degrees of shyness exhibited in childhood are related to being extroverts and life satisfaction in later stages.

The EAS (Emotionality, Activity and Sociability Model) model is used to assess temperament in children. This model measures levels of emotionality, activity, sociability and shyness in children. McCrae and Costa developed the Big Five Model which assesses personality traits in adults. This model measures emotionality, openness to experience, extroversion, agreeableness and conscientiousness. The EAS model in children is believed to be the equivalent for the Big Five Model in adults.
